November Presentation: Deborah Conn

In November, Deborah Conn demonstrated creating watercolor portraits on crinkled tissue paper covered with gesso. She developed that method to add more texture to her portrait paintings, many of which take a full sheet of paper.





To prepare the surface, Deborah takes a tissue paper, crumbles, and tears it, avoiding creating straight edges. Then, the surface is covered with Modge Podge and crinkled tissue paper, and Deborah goes over the paper with a roller to ensure there are no bubbles. The surface dries overnight and then gets covered with one coat of gesso.



For her large paintings, Deborah creates a grid for the image on her computer and then transfers it with no wax transfer paper. Deborah started her painting with an exciting wash of a lot of different colors, including peacock blue, raw sienna, vermillion, deep yellow, coral, and Hooker's green. The blues will later make nice highlights. One of Deborah's favorite warm darks is perylene maroon. For further details, Deborah mainly uses flash tones. Unexpectedly, Deborah used a black-and-white reference while painting in color.







Deborah shared that working on crinkled paper helped her get looser in her paintings while still working realistically. The surface also allows the lifting of paint and softening of edges, providing a lot of flexibility. Deborah's paintings usually have 8 or 9 transparent layers that need to be completely dry before you start the next layer. In the demo, Deborah used a hairdryer. The surface is pretty rough, so we were advised not to use our finest brushes if we try that method of painting. The demo and the discussion on how to approach models, including people from vulnerable populations, to be respectful and see and show people as people no matter what was a treat to MAS members and the public attending the presentation.
